



## Asset Limits Increased for NON-MAGI Programs by Ali Mendiola, MBA, CMSPP

If you are in a Non-MAGI program, I have some good news for you.

As of July 1, 2022, the asset limits for Non-Magi programs increased to \$130,000 for one person and \$65,000 for each additional person, up to a maximum of 10 people.

Many long-term care (LTC) and managed service providers (MSPs) are included. The counties are now using the revised asset limits, shown on the accompanying charts. And remember that the asset limits are the total of all your assets, including income, money in the bank, stocks, income property and any other significant resources you have that are not exempt. The house you live in and your care are exempt from your asset limit.

How does it work? The programming changes were made by SAWS and, as of July 1, 2022, they automated the new aset limited as defined in the ASWDL. The programming of these changes is facilitated by DHCS working with SAWS.

No new Notices of Actions (NOAs) or NOA snippets regarding the implementation will be created by DHCS. SAWS will, however, use existing NOA snippets. SAWS, as of July 1, 2022, updated all of the NOA's with the new asset limit amounts.

A list of notices requiring updating was previously provided by DHCS to the SAWS last November.
